

Resources — RNLD compiles and shares information about conferences, grants, education and training programs, policies, publications, film, theatre, radio and television, news, and the methods and technologies needed to document, archive, revitalise and maintain indigenous languages.

Training — the *Documenting and Revitalising Indigenous Languages* training program is available to Aboriginal and Islander people who want to create and run their own projects to strengthen their language. This flexible program is tailored specifically to your interests and projects, and can be taken just by yourself, or with other people in your family, a small group in your community, or in your workplace.

Advocacy — RNLD advocates on issues such as bilingual education, indigenous literacy, language policies, and recognition for Indigenous peoples. We raise awareness through public events and smaller informal gatherings.
